
I-76 TO LEYDEN STREET NATURAL GAS REVITALIZATION PROJECT

Project Overview

Xcel Energy is replacing up to 3 miles of 10-inch natural gas line in parts of Commerce City, Thornton, and Adams County, Colorado, known as the I-76 to Leyden Street Natural Gas Revitalization Project. This infrastructure replacement project is part of Xcel Energy's commitment to system revitalization, and ensures continued safe, reliable natural gas service to our customers.

The project is currently in the pre-design phase. Construction is scheduled to begin in late 2020 with completion in 2021. Please note that construction schedules are subject to change due to inclement weather or other factors. We will be installing the new natural gas line in the existing easements and public rights-of-way where feasible. Xcel Energy will work with applicable jurisdictions to meet all requirements.

Safety

Public safety is at the foundation of all we do. The safety of the public around Xcel Energy's natural gas system influences every decision we make when we construct and operate natural gas facilities.

The I-76 to Leyden Street Natural Gas Revitalization Project will be designed to meet federal, state, and Xcel Energy standards and safety requirements for installing, maintaining and operating natural gas infrastructure.
